

#5 Col. John Nixon and the *Natural Birth* vs. Jesus and Nicodemus and the *Spiritual Birth*

Key Understanding: *The natural birth vs. the spiritual birth.*
The central doctrine of the *Declaration of Independence*, first read publicly on July 8, 1776, by Col. John Nixon, is mankind’s “natural birthright” to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness, a supposed “right” given to one by God at one’s *natural birth*. This is in direct contrast and emphasis to the doctrines of Jesus Christ surrounding the *spiritual birth* – being ‘born again’ – spoken to Nicodemus in John 3:3.

Nixon, in fulfillment of Daniel 7:8, “. . . *A MOUTH SPEAKING GREAT THINGS . . .*”

“We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable [natural birth] rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness.”
