## #11 Six vs. Seven – The *Declaration of Independence* of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, can be seen in the Church of Laodicea

Key Understanding: The Church of "People's Rights." The doctrines of the Declaration of

Independence, which was signed in Philadelphia, Pa., can even be seen in the etymology of the proper name Laodicea, which can be seen to refer to the 'self-evident rights of the people.' This confirms that the 'Number of God' Seven Church of Laodicea is actually a 'Number of Man' Six Church of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.


Laodicea comes from two words, (1) laos, which means "people," and (2) dike, which is associated with justice and rights. The Church of Laodicea is the Church of "People's Rights."

**Revelation 3:14-17 (KJV)** And unto the angel of <u>THE</u> <u>CHURCH OF THE LAODICEANS</u> write; These things saith the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God;

15 I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot: I would thou wert cold or hot.

16 So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth.

17 Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing; <u>AND KNOWEST NOT THAT THOU ART</u> wretched, and miserable, and poor, and <u>BLIND</u>, and naked:
