

#50 The Legs of Iron – Ivan the Terrible married Anastasia Romanov, whose name means Roman

Key Understanding #1: *Ivan the Terrible married a Roman.* To punctuate that the Russian Empire that began with Vladimir I of Kiev was the extension of the Eastern Leg of Iron of the Roman Empire, the Lord ordained that Ivan the Terrible, who proclaimed Moscow as the Third Rome, marry Anastasia Romanov. *Romanov is Russian for Roman.*

Tsar Ivan IV, the Terrible, wed Anastasia Romanov in 1547. Her brother Nikita was a regent of the empire after Ivan’s death. After years of disorder, called the “Time of Troubles”, Nikita’s grandson, or Anastasia’s grand-nephew, Michael Romanov, became Tsar in 1613. This began the Romanov dynasty that would end in 1917 with the overthrow of Nicholas II, and the subsequent execution of him and his family in 1918.

Key Understanding #2: *The end of the Romanovs was the end of the Eastern Leg of Iron of the Roman Empire.* The end of the Romanovs in 1917 can be said to mark the end of the Eastern Leg of Iron of the Roman Empire [as it flows into the Foot, so to speak], which is why the Lord also ordained that the final ruling family would have the name of *Roman*.

Daniel 2:40 (KJV) And THE FOURTH KINGDOM SHALL BE STRONG AS IRON [the Legs of Iron Roman Empire, extending through the Western Roman Empire, which ended in 476 A.D., and the Eastern Roman Empire, which ended in 1453 A.D. **The Leg of Iron of the Eastern Roman Empire was further extended to include the life of the Russian Empire**]: *forasmuch as iron breaketh in pieces and subdueth all things: and as iron that breaketh all these, shall it break in pieces and bruise.*
