
<u>#83 The Daniel 2:41-43 Feet of Iron and Clay – The War(s) Between the Legs of Diocletian's Split</u>

Let's return to the warring <u>Legs</u> of *Diocletian's* Split, in order to set up our next understanding of the specifics of the wars between the <u>Feet</u> of *Diocletian's* Split. [Reference Unsealings $\frac{#38}{#40}$ for a review of Diocletian's Split.]

[Then we will also be reviewing the warring <u>Legs</u> of Charlemagne's Split, in order to next understand the warring <u>Feet</u> of Charlemagne's Split.]

If you are tracking with this, then you should understand the following:

Key Understanding: *The war(s) between the Legs of Diocletian's Split.* At the beginning of World War I, the *Eastern Orthodox* Tsarist Russian Empire was a part of the Allied effort against the Central Powers of the *Protestant* German Empire and the *Roman Catholic* Austrian-Hungarian Empire. This was an example of the warring *Legs of Diocletian's* Split, with the Russian Empire representing the *Eastern* Roman Empire of *Diocletian's* Split, and the German Empire and Austrian-Hungarian Empire representing the *Western* Roman Empire of *Diocletian's* Split. [This was also the final war ending the 'time of the *Legs* of Iron', so to speak, transitioning into the 'time of the *Feet* of Iron and Clay'.]



Daniel 2:40 (KJV) And THE FOURTH KINGDOM SHALL BE STRONG AS IRON [the Legs of Iron Roman Empire, extending through the Western Roman Empire, which ended in 476 A.D., and the Eastern Roman Empire, which ended in 1453 A.D. <u>The Leg of Iron of the Western Roman Empire was extended to include the life of the Holy Roman Empire, begun by Charlemagne in 800 A.D. Its political power was generally German-based in the earlier centuries, including that of Charlemagne, King Otto I, and Frederick Barbarossa, but more Austrian-based in the later centuries through the <u>Habsburg Dynasty</u>. In the meantime, the Leg of Iron of the Eastern Roman Empire was further extended to include the life of the <u>Russian Empire</u>. <u>The Habsburg Empire and the Russian Empire clashed in World</u> <u>War I.</u>]: forasmuch as iron breaketh in pieces and subdueth all things: and as iron that breaketh all these, shall it break in pieces and bruise.</u>
