
#164 The World War I Second Ascension of America – The Double Rome Marriages: The Marriage of Ivan the Terrible to a Rome woman, and the Marriage of Woodrow Wilson to a Rome woman

The 'Third Rome' Romanov Russian Empire fell during World War I. America emerged from World War I with the position of the Fourth Rome. What verifies and clarifies this further is (a) the marriage of Ivan the Terrible to a Roman woman, and (b) the marriage of Woodrow Wilson, President of the United States during World War I, to a Rome woman.

We will need to review some of Unsealing #50 The Legs of Iron – Ivan the Terrible married Anastasia Romanov, whose name means Roman.

(a) The Marriage of Ivan the Terrible to a Roman woman. To punctuate that the Russian Empire that began with Vladimir I of Kiev was the extension of the Eastern Leg of Iron of the Roman Empire, the Lord ordained that Ivan the Terrible, who proclaimed Moscow as the Third Rome, marry Anastasia Romanov. *Romanov* is Russian for *Roman*. The end of the *Romanovs* in 1917 can be said to mark the end of the Eastern Leg of Iron of the Roman Empire [as it flows into the Foot, so to speak], which is why the Lord also ordained that the final ruling family of the Russian Empire would have the name of *Roman*.

Woodrow Wilson with Ellen Axson Wilson at his 1913 inauguration. She died the next year, on August 6, 1914, during the beginning days of the outbreak of World War I.

(b) The Marriage of Woodrow Wilson, President of the United States during World War I, to a Rome woman.

Woodrow Wilson graduated from Princeton University in 1879, then entered the University of Virginia to study law. In 1882 he moved to Atlanta, Georgia, to begin his career. In the summer of 1883, while on a business trip, Wilson met Ellen Louise Axson at her father's Presbyterian church in **Rome**, **Georgia**. Ellen was born in Savannah, Georgia, the daughter of Samuel Edward Axson, who had been transferred to Rome when Ellen was young. She was raised in Rome, northwest of Atlanta. Wilson extended his stay in Rome for several weeks to court her, but these were difficult times. Ellen's mother had died, and the Reverend Axson collapsed, was committed to an insane asylum, and he too died, on May 28, 1884. Eventually, Woodrow and

Ellen married at her grandparents' home in Savannah on June 24, 1885.

[Rome, Georgia, was named as such because it was built on seven hills, like Rome, Italy.]

Key Understanding: The double Rome marriages. The Lord ordained that Ivan the Terrible wed a Roman (Romanov) woman, which soon spawned the beginning of the Romanov Dynasty of the Russian Empire. Ivan proclaimed the Russian Empire to be the Third Rome, with there never to be a fourth. The Romanov Dynasty and the 'Third Rome' Russian Empire both fell in the midst of World War I. Like Ivan the Terrible, Woodrow Wilson also married a Rome woman, further verifying that America was assuming the mantle of the Fourth Rome while he was President of the United States during World War I, as the Daniel 2:40 Legs of Iron were transitioning to the Daniel 2:41-43 Feet and Toes. [Wilson's wife, the former Ellen Axson, died on August 6, 1914, just days after World War I began.]
