
#234 The Ten Horns of Revelation 13:1 – The Crown Shift from King George III to George Washington, who refused to be King



Key Understanding: The crown shift from King George III to George Washington.
Obviously, the spirit of the 'Bill of Rights' Ten Horns Crown Shift seen in Revelation 13:1 is exemplified through the Crown Shift of America from King George III, who is the culprit in the Declaration of Independence, to George Washington, who refused to become a king, and instead would become the first president (on April 30, 1789).

King George III

Washington turns down being King. After the October 19, 1781, victory at Yorktown, in May 1782, Colonel Lewis Nicola of the Continental Army sent a document to General George Washington on behalf of his officers. It complained of injustices the army had suffered from Congress. It suggested that the army set up a monarchy in America with Washington as King. Washington replied that he read the idea "with abhorrence." He ordered Nicola to "banish these thoughts from your mind."

Revelation 12:3 (KJV) And there appeared another wonder in heaven; and behold <u>A</u>


<u>GREAT RED DRAGON</u>, <u>HAVING SEVEN</u>

The Crowns are shifted from the Seven Heads of Autocracy in Revelation 12:3 to the Ten Horns of Democracy in Revelation 13:1.

Revelation 13:1 (KJV) And I stood upon the sand of the sea[shore], and saw <u>A</u> [Daniel 7:8 Little Horn] <u>BEAST RISE UP OUT OF THE</u>
<u>SEA</u>, HAVING SEVEN HEADS AND TEN HORNS, and <u>UPON HIS</u> [Ten] <u>HORNS TEN</u> <u>CROWNS</u>, and upon his heads the name of blasphemy.
