## **#250 Double Treaties ended the Seven Years' War – December 10 International Human Rights Day, December 15 Bill of Rights Day, and December 10-15 Human Rights Week**

Before we continue on with further understandings of the Lord ordaining the February 10 and February 15 Double Treaties to end the French and Indian War / Seven Years' War, we must

first explain that December 10 is now known as Human Rights Day, and is often paired with December 15, known as Bill of Rights Day.

## **December 10 International Human Rights Day.**

On December 10, 1948, the United Nations General Assembly adopted what is called the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Eleanor Roosevelt, wife of President Franklin D. Roosevelt (d. April 12, 1945), became a champion of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, referring to it as "a Magna Carta for all mankind." In honor of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, December 10 is called Human Rights Day. <u>The roots of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights are</u> greatly attached to the Bill of Rights of the U.S. <u>Constitution</u>.





**December 15 Bill of Rights Day.** In honor of the December 15, 1791, Bill of Rights of the U.S. Constitution, December 15 is referred to as Bill of Rights Day.

**December 10-15 Human Rights Week.** With the December 10, 1948, Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the December 15, 1791, Bill of Rights serving as December 10 and December 15 bookends, the six days from December 10-15 are known as Human Rights Week in the U.S.

Here is **#250–Doc 1**, a presidential proclamation in 2004 honoring December 10 as Human Rights Day, December 15 as Bill of Rights Day, and December 10-15 as Human Rights Week.



Rights Day. December 15 is Bill of Rights Day. December 10-15 is Human Rights Week. The *prophetic* reason for the two dates of December 10 and December 15 will tie back to the Double Treaties of the Seven Years' War of February 10, 1763, and February 15, 1763.
