## #269 The England-Netherlands Pit – The English-Netherlands Bill of Rights of 1689, part 2

Key Understanding (which is the same as is in Unsealing <u>#268</u>): *The English-<u>Netherlands</u> Bill of Rights.* The English Bill of Rights of 1689, which was an antecedent of the American Bill of Rights, was not just connected to *England*, but also to the *Netherlands*. The English Bill of Rights of 1689 helped to lay the foundation for the U.S. 'Bill of Rights' Ten Horns of the Beast, which thus not only had *historical roots* from *England-Netherlands*, but also had the *spiritual roots* that came with those historical roots. Those *spiritual roots* were not from God, but were from the *spiritual abyss*, the *spiritual pit*, the *spiritual netherworld*.


**History leading up to the English-Netherlands Bill of Rights of 1689.** The father of the Dutch Republic (the Netherlands) was William I (1533-1584), Prince of Orange. He was Protestant. His descendant, also Protestant, was William III (1650-1702), Prince of Orange. **William III of the** *Netherlands* would become the King of *England*, in conjunction with and interconnected with the English Bill of Rights of 1689. That is why we are calling the English Bill of Rights of 1689 the English-Netherlands Bill of Rights of 1689.

Here is what occurred. In 1677, William III married his cousin Mary, who was the daughter of who would become King James II of England. [This is the William and Mary after whom is named the second oldest institution of higher learning in the United States, the College of William and Mary at Williamsburg, Virginia, founded in 1693.] Mary was Protestant, while her father, King James II, was Roman Catholic. Because of this, he would have a short reign (1685-1688). When King James II had a son whom he baptized Roman Catholic, there was great anxiety in England about the continuation of Roman

Catholicism on the throne of England. The leading Protestant politicians of England invited Protestants William and Mary of the Dutch Republic (the Netherlands) to invade England with



Dutch forces, overthrow Roman Catholic King James II (William's father-in-law and Mary's father), and establish a Protestant throne. In 1688, William III landed with a force of 14,000 men. King James II was overthrown without bloodshed in what is called the "Glorious Revolution." James II fled to the protection of Roman Catholic France. William and Mary were crowned King and Queen of England on April 11, 1689, **but only after promising to obey the Declaration of Rights, later known as the English Bill of Rights of 1689**.

[In 1690, King William III of England would defeat the former King James II and a French and Irish army at the Battle of the Boyne in Ireland. The Protestants in Ulster, Ireland, backed King William III and because of that are still known today as *Orangemen*.]
