


#293 The Image of the Beast – World Peace through a Partnership of Democratic Nations, part 4, President Bush’s Doctrine of World Peace through Democracy


Key Understanding: “Peace through Democracy” was the outspoken doctrine of Woodrow Wilson and the United States during World War I. “Peace through Democracy” has been the United States’ general formula for world peace since that time. Because of the seemingly better and more reasonable opportunity for world peace after the fall of the Soviet Union, President Bush has more specifically Wilsonianized and attempted to implement the American doctrine of “Peace through Democracy.”



The key parts of President George W. Bush’s January 20, 2005, Second Inaugural Address (*left*) preached the doctrine of “Peace through Democracy.”

“We are led, by events and common sense, to one conclusion: The survival of liberty in our land increasingly depends on the success of liberty in other lands. **The best hope for peace**

in our world is the expansion of freedom in all the world. ... So it is the policy of the United States to seek and support the growth of democratic movements and institutions in every nation and culture, with the ultimate goal of ending tyranny in our world.”
