
#323 Healing Blind Men with Clay – The All-Seeing Eye of God

Eyes like the eyes of man. It is primarily the man-made doctrine of 'God-given unalienable (*natural birth*) rights' that the Lord is referring to when describing 'Little Horn' Beast America in Daniel 7:8 as having "eyes like the eyes of man."

Daniel 7:8 (KJV) I considered the [Ten] HORNS, and, behold, there came up among them another LITTLE HORN, before whom there were THREE OF THE FIRST HORNS plucked up by the roots: and, behold, in this horn were EYES LIKE THE EYES OF [the natural born spiritually blind] MAN [because of the doctrine of 'Godgiven unalienable (natural birth) rights' in the Declaration of Independence], and A MOUTH SPEAKING GREAT THINGS [referring to the Declaration of Independence and its meaning and doctrines, first read publicly by a mouth on 7/8, in fulfillment of Daniel 7:8].

The Eye of Providence. In 1782 the Eye of Providence was adopted as part of the symbolism on the reverse side of the Great Seal of the United States, having been introduced by the original design committee of 1776. On the seal, the Eye is surrounded by the words *Annuit Coeptis*, meaning "It [the Eye of Providence] is favorable to our undertakings." The Eye is positioned above an unfinished pyramid with thirteen steps, representing the original thirteen states and the future growth of the nation. The combined implication is that the Eye, or God, favors the prosperity and purposes of the United States of America, the Daniel 7:8 Little Horn with "eyes like the eyes of man."



Key Understanding: Eyes like the eyes of man. The Lord also chose the description of the Little Horn having "eyes like the eyes of man" because He ordained and knew that the Founding Fathers of America would settle on a Great Seal that would contain the All-Seeing Eye of God, specifically meant to symbolize that God had favored their undertaking of the Declaration of Independence of July 4, 1776, and favored the American cause in the Revolutionary War.

To counter the Founding Fathers' conclusion – evidenced and suggested by the All-Seeing Eye of Providence on the Great Seal of the United States – that God favored their undertakings of the Declaration of Independence and the Revolutionary War, the Lord used the words "eyes like the eyes of man" in Daniel 7:8 to express His disfavor of their undertakings.
