

#467 Pikes Peak and America the Beautiful – The March 28 Death of “America the Beautiful’s” Katharine Bates and Matthew 4:8

Katharine Lee Bates was the lyricist of “America the Beautiful,” which is tied to Pikes Peak in a present-day fulfillment of Matthew 4:8-9. Katharine Lee Bates died on March 28, 1929.

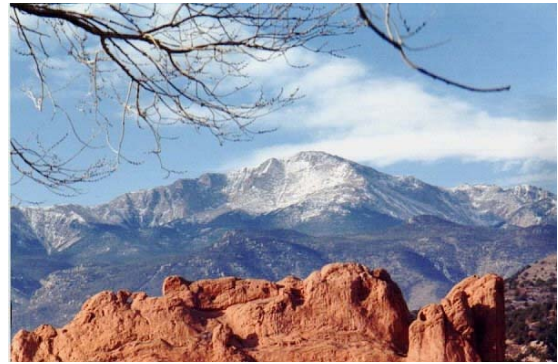
Matthew 4:8-9 (KJV) Again, the devil [the Tempter] taketh him up into AN EXCEEDING HIGH MOUNTAIN [Pikes Peak, the most famous mountain in America, in a present day fulfillment], AND SHEWETH HIM ALL THE KINGDOMS OF THE WORLD [the United States of America – “America the Beautiful” – in a present-day fulfillment], AND THE GLORY OF THEM;

9 And saith unto him, ALL THESE THINGS WILL I GIVE THEE, if thou wilt fall down and worship me.



Katharine Lee Bates (pictured left, around 1900) died on March 28, 1929, which was 11 days before 4/8, pointing to Matthew 4:8. We discussed in Unsealings [#243–#244](#) and [#352](#) (where the example was that Peter Townshend’s birth on May 19, 1945, was 11 days after Tommy’s fictional V-E Day birth of May 8, 1945) that the Lord continually uses the 11-day date change to clarify and verify prophecy.

Key Understanding:
Katharine Lee Bates died on March 28, 1929, 11 days before April 8 = 4/8, pointing to Matthew 4:8, to confirm that Pikes Peak (pictured right) and “America the Beautiful” are joined together in history to serve as a present-day fulfillment of the theme of Matthew 4:8,
