

Boston, England, named after St. Botolph. Saint Botolph was born in England around 610 A.D., and in his youth became a

monk in Gaul (modern day France). By 654 he had returned to England and founded a monastery. The town that grew up around the monastery became known as Botolph's Town, contracted to Botolphston, and finally, Boston.




Boston, England, habitation of devils. The story of Botolph founding the monastery is that he was offered a part of a royal estate, but settled for a wild, barren site that was reported to be *haunted by demons*. "Noxious vapour was exhaled from the ground, and the demons gave vent to terrifying groans. They had dwelt there, they said, for a long time, and had thought to do so forever. They had no other place to go. Why could not St. Botolph seek some other spot" to build his monastery? The idea is that St. Botolph would make the land haunted by demons into holy ground.
