#647 The Cotton Saints vs. the Linen Saints – Cotton Rebellion of the Colonies (Revolutionary War), Cotton Rebellion of the South (Civil War), part 1


In Unsealings #160 and #373, we outlined facts concerning the doubles of the Revolutionary War and Civil War. A key verse was 2 Kings 2:9.

2 Kings 2:9 (KJV) And it came to pass, when they were gone over, that Elijah said unto Elisha, Ask what I shall do for thee, before I be taken away from thee. And Elisha said, I pray thee, let <u>A DOUBLE PORTION OF THY SPIRIT</u> be upon me.

The *Jefferson* **double. Thomas** *Jefferson* **wrote the Declaration of Independence when America revolted against Great Britain, and** *Jefferson*** Davis** quoted from that same Declaration of Independence when the South seceded from the Union.

The North double. Thomas Jefferson and the Declaration of Independence represented the revolution against **Lord North**, the Prime Minister of Great Britain. This was in fulfillment of America lifting up its horn against *the Lord in the north* (Psalm 75:5-7). Jefferson Davis represented the Confederate South in its revolution against the **North**. All of this helped us to see the *Scarlet* double.

The Scarlet double. The South's *Scarlett* ('Gone With The Wind' Civil War) Revolution against the North (1861-1865) was a double of America's *Scarlet* (Revolutionary War) Revolution against Lord North (1775-1783), which birthed *the Scarlet Beast*.




Revelation 17:3 (KJV) So he carried me away in the spirit into the wilderness: and I saw a woman sit upon A SCARLET COLOURED BEAST, full of names of blasphemy, <u>HAVING SEVEN HEADS</u> and TEN HORNS.


Key Understanding: Cotton rebellions. It is time to add the Cotton double to the Jefferson double, North double, and Scarlet double on the list of doubles surrounding the Revolutionary War and Civil War.

The *Cotton* double. The Lord ordained that prophetically there be (1) a <u>Cotton Rebellion of the Colonies</u> against England leading up to and including the *Revolutionary War* (referring especially to the <u>Cotton family</u> and its role and impact), and then (2) a <u>Cotton Rebellion of the South</u> against the North in the *Civil War* (referring especially to <u>cotton</u> as a <u>crop</u> and its role and impact).
