
#664 The Churchill Saints of Daniel 7:21 – The Church-ill Saints

Key Understanding: Winston Churchill. The man considered to be the greatest of all men in England's rich history was Great Britain's World War II wartime prime minister, Winston Churchill. The Lord ordained for Churchill to have such a name and for him to fulfill such a gigantic historical role for the purpose of spiritually/prophetically representing the theme of Church-ill - as in "Church ill," meaning an "ill Church." The saints described in Daniel 7:21, against whom the Little Horn antichrist/antichrist nation prevail(s), are to be called the Church-ill saints, for Winston Churchill was ordained by the Lord to represent himself and other historical figures of antichrist who make war with the saints, and spiritually prevail against them.



This photograph was taken by Yousuf Karsh, a Canadian photographer, when Winston Churchill came to Ottawa. The portrait of Churchill brought Karsh international fame. It is claimed to be the most reproduced photographic portrait in history. It also appeared on the cover of Life magazine.
