## #671 Dunkirk – Church on the Sand, part 1

Now we are moving from <u>The Churchill Saints of Daniel 7:21</u> and introducing the closely related subject of <u>Dunkirk</u>.

**Dunkirk** (Dunkerque in French) is a French seaport city that lies along the Strait of Dover on the English Channel/North Sea close to Belgium. Its name means *church on the dunes*. It would become particularly famous during and because of World War II.

Key Understanding: Church on the sand. Dunkirk would become a center of God's prophetic fulfillment during the course of its history. The city would represent the church on the sand – specifically the building of the Protestant Church on a foundation of sand – in alignment with Matthew 7:26.

## Matthew 7:26 - Church on the Sand

Matthew 7:21-29 (KJV) Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven.
22 Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?



- 23 And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity. 24 Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock:
- 25 And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock.
- 26 And every one that heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them not, shall be likened unto <u>A FOOLISH MAN, WHICH BUILT HIS HOUSE UPON THE SAND</u>:
- 27 And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell: and great was the fall of it.
- 28 And it came to pass, when Jesus had ended these sayings, the people were astonished at his doctrine:
- 29 For he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.
