Unsealing #662 Constantine the Great and Woodrow Wilson – Making War with the Saints

This series will be a continuation of those two Unsealings and is titled **Constantine the Great and Woodrow Wilson, II**.

The reason why we left off from <u>Constantine the Great and Woodrow Wilson</u> was to introduce and elaborate upon the theme of *Making War with the Saints*. The series since then have been:

- The Defeat of the Spanish Armada
- The Gates of Hellevoetsluis
- The Double Eight (88) Kingdoms of England and America
- The Phony War and the Forgotten War

To reintroduce the subject matter, let's revisit certain portions of Unsealing #662:

Constantine the Great. The figure of Constantine the Great represents a beginning of the great and unusual devastation of the Christian Church that has continued to the present day. We can call it 'making war with the Saints.' This is a start to laying the foundation for understanding Constantine's role as a major part of the fulfillment of the antichrist figure of Revelation 6:2.

Revelation 6:2 (KJV) And I saw, and behold <u>A</u>
WHITE HORSE: and <u>HE THAT SAT ON HIM</u>
HAD A BOW; and a crown was given unto him:
and he went forth conquering, and to conquer.



Key Understanding: The two types of warring antichrists. It can be said that there were/are two types of warring Antichrists over the better part of the previous two millenniums. There are those who made/make war <u>against</u> the saints. And there are those who made/make war <u>with</u> the saints.

Making war <u>with</u> the saints. Constantine the Great rose to power shortly after the reign of Diocletian. Warring in the name of the sign of the cross [see Unsealings <u>#42</u> and <u>#42-Doc 1</u>], he was the chief historical and prophetic prototype of an antichrist who makes war <u>with</u> the saints.
