

#753 Constantine the Great and Woodrow Wilson, II – Constantine and Revelation 6:2: A Summary

*Revelation 6:2 (KJV) And I saw, and behold **A WHITE HORSE**: and **HE** [Constantine the Great] **THAT SAT ON HIM HAD A BOW**; and **A CROWN WAS GIVEN UNTO HIM**: and **HE WENT FORTH CONQUERING, AND TO CONQUER**.*

We will be explaining the story in more detail, but here is a summary ahead of time on Constantine and his role as the prototype Antichrist White Horse Rider in the fulfillment of Revelation 6:2. The story surrounds the town of York, England, where Constantine was first crowned emperor.

1. REVELATION 6:2

Constantine died on 5/22 (+ 11 = 6/02), 337 A.D.

2. A WHITE HORSE

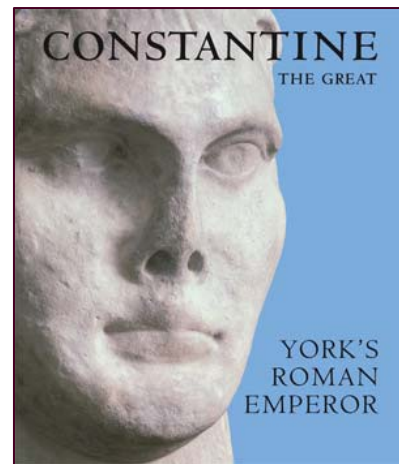
On one of the most famous horse rides in history, young Constantine rides to the English Channel and to York, England, all the way from Nicomedia, modern day Izmit, Turkey. The ride would ultimately result in him being crowned emperor of the western provinces of the Roman Empire. He later rides from York to conquer in the name of the true rider on a white horse, Jesus Christ.

3. A CROWN WAS GIVEN UNTO HIM

At York, England, Constantine was crowned emperor of the western provinces of the Roman Empire. He would eventually conquer all of the Roman Empire.

4. HE THAT SAT ON HIM HAD A BOW

The derivation of the name *York* is often attached by etymologists to the *yew tree*. *Eboracum*, the Roman name for *York*, comes from the Celtic word for *yew*, *eboraca*. **The wood was especially known for making excellent bows.** In addition, Constantine had bowmen in his army as it headed south from York, England.



5. **HE WENT FORTH CONQUERING, AND TO CONQUER**

Constantine went forth from York, England, to conquer the entire Roman Empire.

Next, we will explain the story of the rise of Constantine in more detail. First, let's take a look at a good map which shows the steps of Constantine conquering the Roman Empire. It started at York, England.
