<u>#827 Man o' War – The Death of Ronald Reagan on the day of the Belmont Stakes further</u> connects Ronald Reagan to World War I through Man o' War and August Belmont, Jr.

We have seen the numerous links between Woodrow Wilson/World War I and Ronald Wilson Reagan/Cold War, including the recent tie between Sergeant York, the man, in World War I, and Sergeant York, the horse, with Ronald Reagan. We have also twice covered (Unsealings <u>#660</u>, <u>#812</u>) that Ronald Reagan was born on February 6, 1911, because it was 6 (VI) years before the April 6, 1917, U.S. entry into World War I.


Through the Belmont family and the Belmont Stakes, Ronald Reagan is further connected to World War I.

World War I's Woodrow Wilson, Man o' War, and August Belmont, Jr.

Man o' War was named as such in the natural because of the participation of his owner/breeder, August Belmont, Jr., in World War I. Thus, World War I's Woodrow Wilson is tied to Man o' War and August Belmont, Jr.

The Cold War's Ronald Wilson Reagan, Smarty Jones, and the Belmont Stakes

The Belmont Stakes was named after August Belmont, Senior. Ronald Reagan died on June 5, 2004, the day of that year's Belmont Stakes. Smarty Jones was attempting to win the Triple Crown while the flag flew at half-mast in memory of the President.



Revelation 6:2 (**KJV**) And I saw, and behold <u>A WHITE HORSE</u>: and <u>HE</u> [Constantine the Great representing *Second* Rome Christian *Autocracy*, with the prophetic step to Woodrow Wilson representing *Fourth* Rome Christian *Democracy*] <u>THAT SAT ON HIM HAD A BOW</u> [represented by Sergeant York, the great American soldier hero of World War I]; and a crown was given unto him: and <u>HE WENT FORTH CONQUERING, AND TO CONQUER</u>.

Revelation 6:5 (**KJV**) And when he had opened <u>**THE THIRD SEAL**</u>, I heard the third beast say, Come and see. And I beheld, and lo <u>**A BLACK HORSE**</u>; and he [Ronald Reagan, who died on June 5, 2004, symbolically dismounting for the last time the black horse, Sergeant York] that sat on him had <u>**A PAIR OF BALANCES IN HIS HAND**</u>. [December 10, 1991, was Black Horse Day, meaning that the Black Horse Rider U.S. defeated the Red Horse Rider USSR on that day, during the administration of George H. W. Bush. "Many were made white."]
