<u>#845 The Lutheran Seminary at Gettysburg – The Muhlenbergs from Trappe, part 2, The</u> <u>First Signer of the U.S. Bill of Rights was from Trappe</u>

Frederick Augustus Muhlenberg, of the family that founded the Lutheran Church in America, was the first signer of the U.S. Bill of Rights. Muhlenberg made his home at *Trappe*.

Key Understanding: *The spiritual trap*. The Lord ordained Frederick Muhlenberg to make his home in the birthplace of the Lutherans in America, *Trappe*, Pennsylvania – the name originating from Trap, or Trapp – as a warning that the early American *sword*-carrying Lutherans, with their church/state doctrines, "just war" beliefs, and U.S. Bill of Rights idolizing – fully representative of the spirit and doctrines of the *sword*-carrying Protestant Reformation at large – were/are a spiritual *snare*, or *trap*, for any soul who follows.



Let's use Jeremiah 5:26-27 as our key "snare", or "trap", verse. We will see why shortly.


Jeremiah 5:26-27 (KJV) <u>FOR AMONG MY PEOPLE ARE FOUND WICKED MEN: THEY</u> <u>LAY WAIT, AS HE THAT SETTETH SNARES: THEY SET A TRAP, THEY CATCH MEN.</u> 27 As a cage is full of birds, so are their houses full of deceit: therefore they are become great, and waxen rich.
