#884 Benjamin Franklin and America as Babel – Benjamin Franklin on June 28, 1787, at the Constitutional Convention: "And if a sparrow cannot fall to the ground without His notice, is it probable that an empire can rise without His aid?"

The Lord ordained Benjamin Franklin – who as *the mind which had wisdom* played key roles in the birthing of the Beast, the Eighth – to be born in 1706 [= 1709] to specifically fulfill Revelation 17:09 as the ironic counterfeit of "the mind which hath wisdom."

begin each day with prayer, imploring assistance from Heaven for guidance.

Key Understanding: *The empire rising with His aid.* On the surface, it seems as though Benjamin Franklin was a wise Christian, asking the Lord for help in creating the constitution of the United States of America – "... is it probable that an empire can rise without His aid?" But, instead, Franklin was the American mind which had <u>human</u> wisdom,

creating the constitution of the Beast, the Eighth Kingdom, America, fulfilling as an ironic counterfeit the words "the mind which hath wisdom" in Revelation 17:09. Let's also note that the Lord ordained that Benjamin Franklin's words, "... is it probable that an empire can rise without His aid?", exactly describe the Revelation 17:08 Beast rising out of William Pitt's England.
