
#891 Benjamin Franklin and America as Babel – From the first step of Benjamin Franklin/James Wilson building a Second Babel single democratic nation through the establishment of the U.S. Constitution on September 17, 1787, to the second step of Woodrow Wilson on April 2, 1917, building a worldwide Second Babel through a Partnership of Democratic Nations

The Lord ordained Benjamin Franklin's analogy regarding the builders of Babel in both his June 28, 1787, and September 17, 1787, speeches to reveal that the success of the U.S. Constitutional Convention in completing the uniting of the former colonies into "united states" was indeed a successful building of a *second* Babel of Genesis 11.

Key Understanding: Building a second Babel <u>nation</u> and then a <u>worldwide</u> second Babel. The Lord intends for us to see *two steps* in the attempt to build a *worldwide second* Babel of Genesis 11.

Step 1 – Building a <u>nation</u> as a <u>second</u> Babel

There is the <u>first step</u> of building a <u>single</u> <u>democratic nation</u> as a <u>second</u> Babel, through Benjamin Franklin and the Founding Fathers uniting the former colonies into "united states."




A part of Franklin's speech read by James Wilson, September 17, 1787: "It therefore astonishes me, Sir, to find this system approaching so near to perfection as it does; and <u>I</u> think it will astonish our enemies, who are waiting with confidence to hear that our councils are confounded like those of the Builders of Babel; and that our States are on the point of separation, only to meet hereafter for the purpose of cutting one another's throats."

Step 2 – Building the world as a second Babel

Key Understanding (continued): Then there is the *second step* of Woodrow

Wilson attempting to build a <u>worldwide</u> second Babel through a <u>Partnership of Democratic</u> <u>Nations</u>.



In Unsealing #288 The Image of the Beast – World Peace through a Partnership of Democratic Nations, part 1, Wilson's April 2, 1917, War Message, we covered that in his April 2, 1917, war message to Congress, Woodrow Wilson hoped for the establishment of a Partnership of Democratic Nations, to bring a permanent peace to the world.

"A steadfast concert for peace," the President said, "can never be maintained except by a partnership of democratic nations. No autocratic government could be trusted to keep faith within it or observe its covenants . . . The world must be made safe for democracy. Its peace must be planted upon the tested foundations of political liberty."
