#926 The Woman is also the John Calvin Church/State – Woodrow Wilson and the John Calvin church/state; Woodrow Wilson and the Woman; the Woman and the John Calvin church/state


Ephesians 5:32 (KJV) This is a great mystery: but I speak concerning <u>CHRIST</u> [represented by the man, the husband] <u>AND THE CHURCH</u> [represented by the woman, the wife].

Key Understanding: We have woven together the three subjects of <u>Woodrow Wilson</u>, <u>the John Calvin church/state</u>, and <u>the Woman</u>.



(i) Woodrow Wilson and the John Calvin church/state, seen even in the natural.

Woodrow Wilson was the John Calvinist
Presbyterian president of Princeton and the John Calvinist Presbyterian President of the United States. The Calvinist doctrine – with its special example being Scotland – is that of establishing a church/state for God.





(ii) Woodrow Wilson and the Woman, seen even in the natural. Woodrow Wilson and the Woman go together, seen through Woodrow Wilson's endorsement of the 19th Amendment and the women's right to vote.





(iii) The Woman and the John Calvin church/state, seen in the spiritual. This is seen and understood spiritually, but the reason why Woodrow Wilson became entwined with and endorsed the 19th Amendment and the woman's right to vote was because the Lord was placing together the Woman of Revelation 17:18 – who is "that Great City" Babylon – with the John Calvin church/state.





The Women elect John Calvin. And this is why, quite remarkably, in the first presidential election in which women could vote, the election of 1920, the man that the newly expanded electorate chose for Vice-President of the United States, and who would shortly become President of the United States because of the death of the President, was John Calvin – John Calvin Coolidge.



Revelation 17:18 (KJV) And <u>THE WOMAN</u> which thou sawest <u>IS THAT GREAT CITY</u> [Babylon the Great], which reigneth over the kings of the earth.
