#943 Deceiving the Elect – The meaning of *if it were possible*

Let's explain why the Lord uses the language of *if it were possible* concerning the deceiving of the elect.

Matthew 24:24 (KJV) <u>FOR THERE SHALL ARISE FALSE CHRISTS</u>, and false prophets, <u>AND SHALL SHEW GREAT SIGNS AND WONDERS</u>; insomuch that, <u>IF IT WERE</u> <u>POSSIBLE, THEY SHALL DECEIVE THE VERY ELECT</u>.





Key Understanding: If it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect. The Lord uses the terminology of the elect being deceived – if it were possible to indicate that (i) it is not possible for false Christs and their doctrines - such as Winston Churchill and his doctrines – to deceive a body of those who are the very, or true, elect of God, but that (ii) *it is possible* for false Christs and their doctrines - such as Winston Churchill and his doctrines - to deceive a large body of those who are certain in their own hearts they are the very elect of God, but who are not. Essentially, a misstatement applies to them – that they comprise "the elect who are deceived." It is a misstatement because the fact that they are deceived indicates that they might not be the elect, and instead might be considered on the bubble, since the Lord says if it were possible, indicating that it is not possible. The words *"if it were possible*, they shall deceive the very elect" are worded in such a way as to give the hint that a large number who think they are *the elect*, are not.
