#951 The Whore's Latter Rain - Contrasting Genesis 11 Babel and Acts 2 Pentecost

Before we examine more thoroughly the meaning of the 11 years between the April 9, 1906, birth of the Latter Rain Pentecostal movement in Los Angeles and the April 6 [= 9], 1917, U.S. entry into World War I for the purpose of attempting to build a *worldwide* Second Babel through a Partnership of Democratic Nations, lets solidify that . . .


Key Understanding #1: *Contrasting Genesis 11 Babel and Acts 2 Pentecost.* The Lord always intended for there to be a contrasting correlation between Genesis 11 Babel and Acts 2 Pentecost. Therefore, we should not think it strange that the Lord paired together "<u>speaking in tongues</u>" of April 9, 1906, with <u>Babel</u> of April 6 [= 9], 1917.



Key Understanding #2: Contrasting Genesis 11 Babel and Acts 2 Pentecost. Acts 2 Pentecost was the antithesis of Genesis 11 Babel. It was God's answer to Babel. Let's contrast Genesis 11 Babel with Acts 2 Pentecost.

Genesis 11:1, 5-9 (KJV) And THE WHOLE EARTH WAS OF <u>ONE</u> <u>LANGUAGE</u>, and <u>ONE SPEECH</u> [Woodrow Wilson's April 2, 1917, 'The World Must Be Made Safe for Democracy' Speech]. 5 And <u>THE LORD CAME DOWN</u> to see the city and the tower, which the children of men builded. 6 And the LORD said, Behold, <u>THE PEOPLE IS ONE</u>, and they have all <u>ONE LANGUAGE</u>; and this they begin to do: and now NOTHING WILL BE <u>RESTRAINED</u> FROM THEM, which they have <u>IMAGINED</u> to do. 7 Go to, LET US GO DOWN, AND THERE <u>CONFOUND</u> THEIR LANGUAGE, that they may not understand one another's speech.

8 So <u>THE LORD SCATTERED THEM ABROAD</u> from thence upon the face of all the earth: and they left off to build the city. 9 THEREFORE IS THE NAME OF IT CALLED <u>BABEL</u>; because the LORD did there confound the language of all the earth: and from thence did the LORD scatter them abroad upon the face of all the earth.

Acts 2:1-8 (KJV) And when <u>THE DAY OF PENTECOST</u> was fully come, <u>THEY WERE ALL WITH ONE ACCORD</u> in one place. 2 And suddenly <u>THERE CAME A SOUND FROM HEAVEN</u> as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. 3 And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them.

4 And <u>THEY WERE ALL FILLED WITH THE HOLY GHOST,</u> <u>AND BEGAN TO SPEAK WITH OTHER TONGUES</u>, as the Spirit gave them utterance. 5 And THERE WERE DWELLING AT JERUSALEM JEWS,

DEVOUT MEN, OUT OF EVERY NATION UNDER HEAVEN.



6 Now when this was noised abroad, the multitude came together, and were confounded, because that **EVERY MAN HEARD THEM SPEAK IN HIS OWN LANGUAGE**.

7 And they were all amazed and marvelled, saying one to another, Behold, are not all these which speak Galilaeans?

8 And how hear we every man in our own tongue, wherein we were born?

Key Understanding #3: Contrasting Genesis 11 Babel and Acts 2 Pentecost. The Lord had called Abraham out of Babylon. Likewise, since "there were dwelling at Jerusalem Jews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven" (Acts 2:5), Pentecost was representing the calling of men out of the scattered Babel nations of the earth, into one accord, for God. Pentecost was the antithesis of Babel.

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
