The Civil War would end at the "old Raine" property. A man by the name of Charles Raine built the home (tavern) which would be the location of the surrender of Robert E. (Edward) Lee to Ulysses S. Grant. Wilmer McLean bought the Raine property, moving to Appomattox Court House in 1863. On the morning of April 9, 1865, General Robert E. (Edward) Lee realized that the retreat of his beleaguered army had finally been halted. U.S. Grant was riding toward Appomattox Court House where Union troops had blocked the Confederate path. Lee sent a letter to Grant requesting a meeting to discuss his army's

surrender. Colonel Charles Marshall rode ahead of Lee in order to find a location for the generals' conference. As Marshall passed through the village, he found Wilmer McLean. He asked McLean if he knew of a suitable location. McLean took him to an empty house that was

without furniture. Marshall immediately rejected the house. McLean then offered his own home. After seeing the comfortable country home, Marshall readily accepted and sent Sergeant Tucker back to inform General Lee that a meeting site had been found. Lee and Grant would meet at what historians refer to as the McLean House, but also the "old Raine" property, meaning the *former Raine* property.



the *former Raine* property to be the exact location of the end of the Civil War on April 9, 1865, because the Lord was styling the victory by the Union as a (counterfeit) *former rain* outpouring of the Spirit of the Lord, so as to attach the (counterfeit) *Joel's Latter Rain* theme to the April 6 [= 9], 1917, U.S. entry into World War I.
