#966 The Whore's Latter Rain – The Scarlet Woman of World War I, part 3, Joel Flood of the South during the Civil War is later represented through his son, Henry de la Warr Flood, during World War I

"The rebels are our countrymen again." What we have been leading up to is the story of the Civil War father, Major Joel Flood, and his World War I son, Henry de la Warr Flood. It is important to observe that the Joel Flood family lived in the South, in Appomattox County, Virginia, and fought for the South during the Civil War. The story is that Major Flood surrendered at Appomattox Court House and rode a few miles to his plantation at Eldon where his wife served supper to the Major and a Union Colonel. It sounds like they were instantly on good terms. The reason for that little noted event is that the Lord was showing the reality of the South becoming a part of the Union. As Grant said upon the surrender of Robert E. (Edward) Lee at Appomattox, "The war is over; the rebels are our countrymen again."



Key Understanding: Joel Flood of the Civil War and Henry de la Warr Flood of World War I. Joel Flood of the South during the Civil War became represented through his son, Henry de la Warr, during World War I, because, after all, "the rebels are our countrymen again." The prophetic significance is that the spirit of the Scarlett South against the North during the Civil War is a picture of the spirit of the United States unknowingly set against the Lord during World War I. The United States was the bald Calvinistic Protestant Reformation Scarlet Woman, "that Great City" Babylon, waging the Men o' War (and Henry de la Warr) sword in the name of Jesus Christ, to Make the World Safe for Democracy.

Since the spirit of Making the World Safe for Democracy through the sword was deemed to be of Jesus Christ, in the mind of the bald Calvinist Woodrow Wilson-led Protestant Reformation Woman, it was representative of an outpouring of the Lord's Spirit – which the Lord has designated as a *Joel's Latter Rain* spirit.



[Note: Major Joel Flood would live to see World War I, but not America's entry into World War I. He died on October 23, 1916, and was buried in Vera, Virginia, in the Flood Cemetery at the old home which was used as Confederate Lt. General Longstreet's last headquarters. His son, Henry de la Warr Flood, died on December 8, 1921. A grandson of Major Joel Flood, who was also the nephew of Henry de la Warr Flood and Joel West Flood, was Harry Flood Byrd, Sr., who served as U.S. Senator from Virginia from March 4, 1933, until his resignation on November 10, 1965. He was immediately replaced by his son, Harry Flood Byrd, Jr., who served as U.S. Senator from Virginia from November 12, 1965, to January 2, 1983.]
