#1063 The Door of Heaven and the Gate of God – The "Open Doors" of Revelation 3:8, Revelation 3:20, and Revelation 4:1

We are now progressing from <u>The Revelation 3:21 Grant</u> to <u>The Door of Heaven and the Gate</u> <u>of God</u>.

Key Understanding #1: *The "open door.*" The theme of "open door" is a thread that runs from the letter to the church in Philadelphia (Revelation 3:8) to the letter to the church in Laodicea (Revelation 3:20), and then to the beginning of the next chapter (Revelation 4:1).

Revelation 3:7-10, 14-22 (KJV) And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These

things saith he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David, he that openeth, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth;

8 I know thy works: behold, <u>I have set before</u> <u>thee AN OPEN DOOR</u>, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name. 9 Behold, I will make them of the synagogue of Satan, which say they are Jews, and are not, but do lie; behold, I will make them to come and worship before thy feet, and to know that I have loved thee.



10 Because thou hast kept the word of my patience, I also will keep thee from the hour of temptation, which shall come upon all the world, to try them that dwell upon the earth.

14 And unto the angel of <u>the church of the Laodiceans</u> write; These things saith the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God;

15 I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot: I would thou wert cold or hot. 16 So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth.

17 Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing; and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and <u>blind</u>, and naked: 18 I counsel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayest be rich; and white raiment, that thou mayest be clothed, and that the shame of thy nakedness do not appear; and <u>anoint</u> thine eyes with eyesalve, that thou mayest see.

19 As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent.

20 Behold, <u>I STAND AT THE DOOR</u>, and knock: <u>if any man</u> <u>hear my voice, and OPEN THE DOOR</u>, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.

21 <u>To him that overcometh WILL I GRANT to sit with me in</u> my throne, even as I also overcame, and am set down with my

Father in his throne.

22 He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches.

Revelation 4:1-2 (KJV) After this I looked, and, behold, <u>A DOOR WAS OPENED in</u> <u>heaven</u>: and the first voice which I heard was as it were of a trumpet talking with me; which said, Come up hither, and I will shew thee things which must be hereafter. 2 <u>And immediately I was in the spirit: and,</u> <u>behold, a throne was set in heaven, and one</u> <u>sat on the throne</u>.

Key Understanding #2: Note that two topics that are found near the end of Revelation 3

in the letter to the church of Laodicea, (1) *the opening of a door*, and (2) *the throne in heaven*, are found at the beginning of Revelation 4.
