#1167 The Curse of Jehoiakim and the Lineage of Jesus Christ – The Two Nathans, part 6, *Reviewing Unsealing #27* and adding to it the prophet Nathan's curse upon the house of David

Here is a repeat of Unsealing $\frac{#27}{}$:

<u>#27 Man of War – King David Was Not Allowed to Build the Temple of God because he</u> was a Man of War

King David was not allowed by the Lord to build the Temple, the House of God, because he had been a man of war. David's son Solomon then built the Temple.

1 Chronicles 28:3 (KJV) But God said unto me [King David], THOU SHALT NOT BUILD AN HOUSE [the Temple] FOR MY NAME, BECAUSE THOU HAST BEEN A MAN OF WAR, AND HAST SHED BLOOD.

Key Understanding: *King David was not allowed to build the Temple because he was a man of war.* The Lord's purpose in emphasizing that David could not build the House of God – because he was a man of war – was to show that those who would be a part of the future 'House of God' Body of Christ during the Church Age *would not truly be so*, if they were men of war in their deeds or in their hearts. Their allegiances and doctrines would still be attached to themselves and their earthly kingdoms.

A depiction of Solomon's Temple, which David was not allowed to build, for he was a man of war.

As concerns King David . . . <u>this is why the Lord</u> ordained that David's adultery with Bathsheba

was attached to David being a man of war. After having failed through his recall of Uriah from war to Jerusalem, as a shield to cover his sin with Bathsheba, David sent Uriah back to the front lines of battle, where he was killed. <u>Through David's *physical* adultery, the Lord is linking the spirit of *spiritual* adultery in the church with one being of the spirit of a man of war.</u>

[The *above* paragraph ended Unsealing $\frac{#27}{...}$ Let's now add the key verses of 2 Samuel 12:9-10 and the Key Understanding for this Unsealing #1167.]

2 Samuel 12:9-10 (KJV) <u>Wherefore hast thou despised the commandment of the LORD, to</u> <u>do evil in his sight? thou hast killed Uriah the Hittite with the sword</u>, and <u>hast taken his</u> <u>wife to be thy wife</u>, and hast slain him with the sword of the children of Ammon. 10 <u>NOW THEREFORE THE SWORD SHALL NEVER DEPART FROM THINE</u> <u>HOUSE; because thou hast despised me</u>, and hast taken the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be thy wife.

Key Understanding (of this Unsealing #1167): Now therefore the sword shall never depart from thine house. The Lord purposely attached David's physical adultery with Bathsheba (and corresponding spiritual adultery toward God) to David being a Man of War (through David sending Uriah to the frontlines during war), because the Lord is linking the spirit of spiritual adultery in the church with the spirit of a Man o' War. This is also why the Lord's curse upon David through the prophet Nathan in 2 Samuel 12:10 was that the sword – an instrument which reflects the spirit of a Man o' War – would not depart from his house.

So while Joab had the city under siege, he put Uriah at a place where he knew the strongest defenders were. When the men of the city came out and fought against Joab, some of the men in David's army fell; moreover, Uriah the Hittite died. 2 Samuel 11:16-17
