

Key Understanding: The Old Testament Feast of the Passover (and Consecration of the Firstborn, which represents the Passover) and the Feast of Unleavened Bread are seen in the New Testament through Jesus' words in John 6:53-56. The <u>drinking of the blood</u> of Jesus Christ is associated directly with <u>Passover</u> (and the Consecration of the Firstborn, which represents the Passover), while <u>eating the flesh</u> of Jesus Christ directly reflects the <u>Feast of Unleavened Bread</u>.

John 6:53-56, 66 (KJV) Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except ye <u>EAT THE FLESH OF THE SON OF MAN</u>, and <u>DRINK HIS BLOOD</u>, ye have no life in you.

54 Whoso <u>EATETH MY FLESH</u>, and <u>DRINKETH MY BLOOD</u>, hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day.

55 For <u>MY FLESH IS MEAT INDEED</u>, and <u>MY BLOOD IS DRINK</u> indeed. 56 He that <u>EATETH MY FLESH</u>, and <u>DRINKETH MY BLOOD</u>, dwelleth in me, and I in him.

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
