Here is an excerpt from a July 14, 2007, article after another journalist was killed in Baghdad, Iraq, during the Iraq War:

"Iraq has become an extraordinarily dangerous place for journalists, with 110 killed since the U.S.-led invasion in 2003 along with 40 media support workers, more than 80 per cent of them Iraqi. The death toll of 110 in four years compares with 63 in the 20 years of the Vietnam War."

Key Understanding: *The media deaths in the Iraq War*. The Iraq War that began in 2003 was more dangerous for the <u>media</u> in comparison to previous wars in which America participated because the war prophetically began as the <u>second</u> (and <u>counterfeit</u>) <u>Media-Persia United States vs. the Saddam Hussein regime of <u>pretender Babylon Iraq</u>.</u>




