## **#1401 The relationship between Daniel 2:42 and U.N. Resolution 242 – U.N. Resolution 242, part 1, Land for Peace: November 22, 1967, Resolution 242**

**Daniel 2:42** (KJV) And as the TOES OF THE FEET were part of IRON [Eisenhower – the Man of Iron – and the Rod of Iron U.S.], and part of CLAY [Stalin – the Man of Steel – and the 1991 Fall of the USSR], so <u>THE KINGDOM SHALL BE PARTLY STRONG</u>, and <u>PARTLY BROKEN</u>.

Key Understanding: *Land for peace*. The foundation of U.N. Security Council Resolution 242 of November 22, 1967, was and is "land for peace." In other words, Israel would give back land captured during the 1967 Six-Day War in exchange for a promise of peace from its Arab neighbors. [The Camp David Accords of September 17, 1978, were an agreement between Egypt and Israel in accordance with U.N. Resolution 242; Israel agreed to return most of the Sinai Peninsula to Egypt in exchange for a full peace.]

Here is the text of the "land for peace" U.N. Security Council Resolution 242 of November 22, 1967:



The Camp David Accords, signed in the United States in September 1978 by Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin and Egyptian President Anwar Sadat, were the first peace deal between Israel and an Arab state

The Security Council;

Expressing its continuing concern with the grave situation in the Middle East,



Emphasizing the inadmissibility of the acquisition of territory by war and the need to work for <u>a just and lasting peace</u> in which every State in the area can live in security,

Emphasizing further that all Member States in their acceptance of the Charter of the United Nations have undertaken a commitment to act in accordance with Article 2 of the Charter,

1. Affirms that the fulfillment of Charter principles requires the establishment of <u>a just</u> <u>and lasting peace in the Middle East</u> which should include the application of both the following principles:

(i) Withdrawal of Israeli armed forces from territories occupied in the recent conflict;

(ii) Termination of all claims or states of belligerency and respect for and acknowledgement of the sovereignty, territorial integrity and political independence of every State in the area and their right to live in peace within secure and recognized boundaries free from threats or acts of force;

2. Affirms further the necessity

(a) For guaranteeing freedom of navigation through international waterways in the area;

(b) For achieving a just settlement of the refugee problem;

(c) For guaranteeing the territorial inviolability and political independence of every State in the area, through measures including the establishment of demilitarized zones;

3. Requests the Secretary-General to designate a Special Representative to proceed to the Middle East to establish and maintain contacts with the States concerned in order to promote agreement and assist efforts to achieve a peaceful and accepted settlement in accordance with the provisions and principles in this resolution;

4. Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the progress of the efforts of the Special Representative as soon as possible.
