#1406 The relationship between Daniel 2:42 and U.N. Resolution 242 – Alexei Kosygin and Lenin; Alexei Kosygin and Lennon, part 2, A Man of Linen

Kosygin, a Man of Linen

Alexei Kosygin (right) joined the Red Army in 1919 at the age of 15 and fought in the Russian Civil War.


Afterwards, he received his education at the Leningrad Cooperative College and then worked in Siberia, joining the Communist Party in 1927. In the 1930's he attended the Leningrad Textile Institute, after which he worked as an engineer, rising to become managing director of the



Oktyabrskaya textile factory in Leningrad.

Joseph Stalin's Great Purge caused a number of openings in the party administration, allowing Kosygin to enter full time party work in 1938, first as head of the Leningrad party's industrial and transport department and then as mayor of Leningrad. In 1939 he joined the Soviet cabinet as People's Commissar for the textile industry. That same year, Kosygin was elected to the Central Committee of the Communist Party. From 1940 to 1946 he was deputy chairman of the Council of People's Commissars of the USSR with responsibility for consumer industries.

After World War II, Kosygin became a candidate member of the Politburo, becoming a full member in 1948. He briefly served as minister of finance of the USSR in 1948 and then as minister for light industry until 1953. Following the death of Stalin in March 1953 Kosygin was demoted, but as a staunch ally of Nikita Khrushchev his career soon turned around. He became chairman of the USSR

State Committee for Planning in 1959 and then a full member of the Politburo in 1960.

Key Understanding: Alexei Kosygin – a man of linen. Linen is a textile. The Lord ordained Alexei Kosygin, Soviet Premier from 1964 to 1980, to be prominently associated with the textile industry (and thus also the <u>linen</u> industry) in the Soviet Union – through (i) his attending of the Leningrad Textile Institute, (ii) his position as managing director of a textile factory in Leningrad, and (iii) his joining of the Soviet cabinet as People's Commissar for the textile industry – so as to emphasize his historical association with V. I. <u>Lenin</u> in his political career, and his prophetic association with the December 8, 1980, death of <u>John Lennon</u> and the December 8-10, 1991, death of <u>Soviet Leninism</u> (through Kosygin's own death, which we will be discussing).
