Key Understanding #1: Alexander the Great in Daniel 11. The purpose of this Unsealing is to see Alexander the Great and the 4 kingdoms of Cassander, Lysimachus, Ptolemy, and Seleucus in **Daniel 11** (specifically Daniel 11:3-4).


Key Understanding #2: In Daniel 11:3-4, the Mighty King who stands up and rules with great dominion, but then is broken, is Alexander the Great, with his kingdom being divided toward the 4 (four) winds of heaven, referring to the 4 (four) kingdoms of Ptolemy, Seleucus, Cassander, and Lysimachus.

Daniel 11 – The Mighty King who is broken, after which his kingdom is divided toward the four winds of heaven

Daniel 11:1-4 (KJV) Also I in the first year of Darius the Mede, even I, stood to confirm and to strengthen him. 2 And now will I shew thee the truth. Behold, there shall stand up yet three kings in Persia; and the fourth shall be far richer than they all: and by his strength through his riches he shall stir up all against the realm of Grecia. 3 And A MIGHTY KING [Alexander the Great] SHALL STAND UP, that shall rule with great dominion, and do according to his will. 4 And when he shall stand up, HIS KINGDOM SHALL BE BROKEN [Alexander the Great's death in 323 B.C.], AND SHALL BE DIVIDED TOWARD THE FOUR WINDS OF HEAVEN [the 4 (four) kingdoms of Ptolemy, Seleucus, Cassander, and Lysimachus, specifically fulfilled through the Battle of Ipsus, in 301 B.C., the final year of the 4<sup>th</sup> century B.C.; compare
