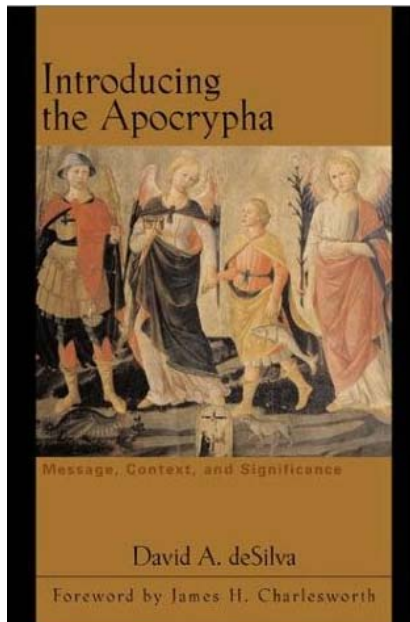
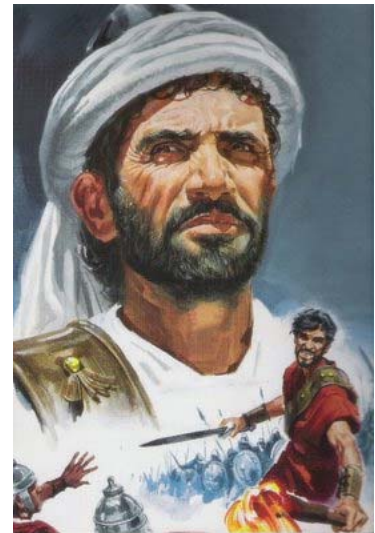


#1597 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The series of 4's (fours) from Alexander the Great to Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 5u, Antiochus IV: 1 Maccabees



Key Understanding:
1 Maccabees. The apocryphal book of 1 Maccabees is a narrative of the historical events surrounding the atrocities of Antiochus IV Epiphanes against Jerusalem, the Temple, and the Jewish religion, and the resulting Jewish revolt against him. Essentially, the atrocities of Antiochus IV Epiphanes are in fulfillment of Daniel 8:10-12.

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Antiochus III the Great and Antiochus IV Epiphanes fulfilled Daniel 8:9

Daniel 8:9 (KJV) And OUT OF ONE OF THEM [the Syrian kingdom of Seleucus, or the Seleucid Empire] CAME FORTH A LITTLE HORN, which waxed EXCEEDING GREAT, toward THE SOUTH, and toward THE EAST, and toward THE PLEASANT LAND [Antiochus IV Epiphanes, but the verse should be viewed prophetically with his

father, Antiochus III the Great, prominently and powerfully in the foreground, with the name Antiochus III the Great even reflecting the words “*waxed exceeding great*”].

Antiochus IV Epiphanes fulfilled Daniel 8:10-12

Daniel 8:10-12 (KJV) And it waxed great, even to the host of heaven; and it cast down some of the host and of the stars to the ground, and stamped upon them.

11 Yea, he magnified himself even to the prince of the host, and by him the daily sacrifice was taken away, and THE PLACE OF HIS [the Lord’s] SANCTUARY WAS CAST DOWN.

12 And an host was given him against the daily sacrifice by reason of transgression, and it cast down the truth to the ground; and it practised, and prospered.

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
