Key Understanding: Western Star and Epiphany, January 6, 1941. Western Star is obviously referring to the rise of America – like a rising sun, or rising star. The United States of America was/is the Western Star. Moreover, because Western Star was written by Stephen Vincent Benet, who died on the date of the Saturday Evening Post edition that contained his

essay on the final of the Four Freedoms, Western Star is attached to the Four Freedoms of Epiphany, January 6, 1941. This makes total sense for the rise of America as the Western Star is as such because it is the world's Shrine of Democracy, epitomized by the Four Freedoms.
