

#1717 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The pre-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 10, *The Northwest Ordinance and Freedom: Slavery was forbidden in the Northwest Territory*

The Northwest Ordinance banned slavery in the Northwest Territory. The banning of slavery in the Northwest Territory by the Northwest Ordinance effectively established the Ohio River as the boundary between free and slave territory in the region between the Appalachian Mountains and the Mississippi River. The division set the stage for the balancing act between free states and slave states that was the basis for the most critical political question in America until it was resolved by the Civil War.

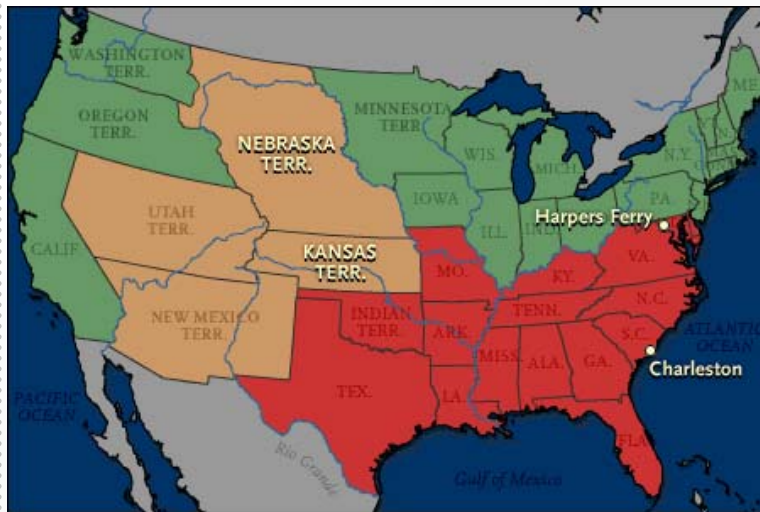

Key Understanding: The Northwest Ordinance is closely associated with the prohibition of slavery.

Daniel 8:9 (KJV) And OUT OF ONE OF THEM [the second Syria, the United States, located in the northwest part of the world] CAME FORTH A LITTLE HORN, which waxed EXCEEDING GREAT [from the George Rogers Clark Northwest Territory – in which slavery was forbidden by the Northwest Ordinance – and the Lewis and William Clark northwest territory], toward THE SOUTH, and toward THE EAST, and toward THE PLEASANT LAND.
