

#1723 The Yom Kippur War and the Abomination of Desolation – The pre-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the South and toward the East as a *second* Syria/Antiochus IV Epiphanes, part 16, *Toward the South: Latin American independence from Spain was triggered by American independence from Great Britain*

Colonial rule of Latin America by Spain lasted about 300 years. The movements for independence from Spain in Latin America in the early 1800's were caused by a number of factors, but were finally triggered by the success of the Revolutionary War in America (1775-1783) and the ideals of freedom and equality inspired by the French Revolution (1789-1799).

Mexico and Central America gained their independence from Spain in 1821. Simon Bolivar's victories from 1819-1824 over the Spaniards gained independence for the Spanish colonies in northern South America – Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru, and Venezuela. Earlier, San Martin had freed Argentina (1816) and Chile (1818) from Spanish rule.

Key Understanding: Because the French Revolution was also inspired by the American Revolution, it is easy to understand that American independence from England ultimately helped to trigger Latin American independence from Spain. This was another direct fulfillment of Daniel 8:9, with the freedom of America waxing great toward the *south* – Latin America.

In the fulfillment of Daniel 8:9, the Spanish colonies (toward the *south*), in gaining their independence from Spain, followed the example and lead of the independence of the English colonies to the *north* in the formation of the United States of America, the Little Horn of Daniel 7:8 and the Little Horn of Daniel 8:9.

*Daniel 8:9 (KJV) **And OUT OF ONE OF THEM** [the *second* Syria, the United States, located in the northwest of the world] **CAME FORTH A LITTLE HORN, which waxed EXCEEDING GREAT toward THE SOUTH** [for American independence (from which came the Northwest Territory with its slave-prohibiting Northwest Ordinance) triggered independence of Spanish colonies from Spain toward the south], **and toward THE EAST, and toward THE PLEASANT LAND.***
