Key Understanding: The Truman Doctrine. The Truman Doctrine against Soviet expansion helped Greece and Turkey avoid the Soviet sphere, as part of the picture of the post-World War II U.S. waxing great toward the south, toward the east, and toward the pleasant land. Greece and Turkey became a part of NATO. The map below shows the USSR and the nations of the Warsaw Pact (established May 14, 1955), and nations of NATO (established beginning April 4, 1949). Neutral nations are shown in gray. The effectiveness of the Truman Doctrine resulted in Greece and Turkey becoming a part of the Western alliance of NATO.
