According to his own account, Sennacherib laid siege to Jerusalem, shut up Hezekiah in the city "like a bird in a cage," and was completely victorious. He did not succeed in taking Jerusalem, however, and returned to Assyria after imposing heavy tribute upon Hezekiah. Unmentioned in Sennacherib's account are accounts in the Old Testament that say that Sennacherib was forced to retreat to Nineveh because of a plague which devastated his army. In 2 Kings 19:35 (and the account is also seen in Isaiah 37:36), we are told ...

2 Kings 19:35 (KJV) And it came to pass that night, that the angel of the LORD went out, and smote in the camp of the Assyrians an hundred fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead corpses.

Isaiah 37:34-37 (KJV) By the way that he [Sennacherib] came, by the same shall he return, and shall not come into this city, saith the LORD.

35 For I will defend this city to save it for mine own sake, and for my servant David's sake.

36 Then the angel of the LORD went forth, and smote in the camp of the Assyrians a hundred and fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead corpses. 37 So Sennacherib king of Assyria departed, and went and returned, and dwelt at Nineveh.
