

Review (from the previous Unsealing): *Nothing to fear*. Franklin D. Roosevelt is considered to be one of the greatest presidents in United States history because of his guidance of the nation through two different crises, the Great Depression and World War II. The theme of "nothing to fear" is attached to each. Roosevelt's words of encouragement concerning the Great Depression, "the only thing we have to fear is fear itself," were spoken on March 4, 1933, in his first inaugural address, while "freedom from fear" was a part of his 'Four Freedoms' speech of January 6, 1941, and concerned World War II.




Here is #1909–Doc 1, which contains facts about Franklin D. Roosevelt's first inauguration on March 4, 1933.

Key Understanding: The 'nothing to fear' president. Franklin D. Roosevelt was ordained by the Lord to from "day one," March 4, 1933, have the prophetic legacy of being the 'freedom from fear' president, telling the country in the first portion of his first inauguration speech that "the only thing we have to fear is fear itself." What the Lord was pointing toward from day one was Roosevelt's 'Four Freedoms' speech of January 6, 1941 – freedom of speech, freedom of worship, freedom from want, and <u>freedom from fear</u> – the purpose of which was to prepare the United States to aid Great Britain in its war against Hitler and Nazi Germany.
