



part 169, The Teapot Dome Scandal: The fall of Albert Fall

Key Understanding #1: The Teapot Dome Scandal is tied to the first inauguration of Franklin D. Roosevelt. The Teapot Dome Scandal and the fall of Albert Fall are being covered at this point in time because – as will be discussed in Unsealings #1913–#1914 – the fall of Albert Fall is prophetically tied to the March 4, 1933, 'nothing to fear' inauguration of Franklin D. Roosevelt and the 'freedom from fear' World War II resistance to Nazi Germany.

Albert Fall and the Teapot Dome Scandal. The Teapot Dome Scandal was an oil reserve scandal that began during the Republican administration of President Warren G. Harding. The **Teapot Dome** oil field (shown in the picture on the *right*), located in the county of Natrona, Wyoming, was named after the teapot-shaped rock above the field (shown in the picture on the lower right). Teapot Dome was one of three underground oil reserves set aside by President Woodrow Wilson for use by the Navy during emergency situations of a decline in normal oil supplies. [Another source says, "The naval oil reserves were three oil-rich tracts of land set aside by the Taft Administration to provide naval ships with fuel in case of a national emergency."] The protection of the naval oil reserves was short-lived however. President Warren Harding's Secretary of the Interior, Albert B. Fall, opposed the conservation of this oil field for naval use and convinced the Secretary of the Navy, Edwin Denby, to release control of the oil fields. In 1921, by executive order of the President, control of naval oil reserves at Teapot Dome, Wyoming, and at Elk Hills, California, was transferred from the Navy Dept. to the Dept. of the Interior. In 1922, Albert Fall leased, without competitive bidding, the Teapot Dome, Wyoming, field to Harry F. Sinclair, an oil operator, and leased the field at Elk Hills, California, to Edward L. Doheny.



These transactions became (1922-23) the subject of a Senate investigation conducted by U.S. Senator Thomas J. Walsh. [Walsh became a national hero and a figurehead in the fight against government corruption. Because of this, Franklin D. Roosevelt would later ask Walsh to become his Attorney General in his first administration. Walsh died on March 2, 1933, while traveling to accept his appointment as Attorney General.] It was found that in 1921, Doheny had lent Fall \$100,000, interest-free, and that upon Fall's retirement as Secretary of the Interior (March, 1923), Sinclair also "loaned" him a large amount of money. The investigation led to criminal prosecutions. Fall was indicted for conspiracy and for accepting bribes. Convicted of the latter charge, he was sentenced to a year in prison and fined \$100,000. In another trial for bribery Doheny and Sinclair were acquitted, although Sinclair was subsequently sentenced to prison for contempt of the Senate and for employing detectives to shadow members of the jury in his case. The oil fields were restored to the U.S. government through a Supreme Court decision in 1927. [Sources included the *Columbia Encyclopedia*.]



Key Understanding #2: Albert Fall and Genesis 3. Over the course of the next few Unsealings, it will be seen that the prophetic story of the fall of Albert Fall is tied to both (i) the fall of man, seen in Genesis 3, and (ii) the fall of the Jews, seen in Romans 11:22.

Genesis 3:3-4 (KJV) But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden [the tree of knowledge of good and evil] God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, LEST YE <u>DIE</u>. [Genesis 2:17 (KJV) But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.]

4 And the serpent said unto the woman, <u>YE SHALL NOT</u> <u>SURELY DIE</u>:

Romans 11:22 (KJV) Behold therefore the goodness <u>AND</u> <u>SEVERITY OF GOD</u> [NIV . . . <u>sternness</u> of God]: <u>ON THEM</u>

[natural Jews, spoken of as Israel] <u>WHICH FELL</u>, <u>SEVERITY</u> [fulfilled in part through the actions of the <u>competing</u> <u>stern-faced</u> <u>king</u>, Adolf Hitler and Nazi Germany, especially pointing to the event of Kristallnacht, <u>November 9-10-11, 1938 {= 11:20,21,22}</u>, which marked a beginning to the Holocaust]; <u>but toward thee, goodness, if thou continue in his goodness:</u> <u>OTHERWISE THOU ALSO SHALT BE CUT OFF</u>.
