Kennedy at his burial on November 25, 1963].

Key Understanding #2: Kennedy's inauguration and death/burial are part of Daniel 7:11. The point is that both Kennedy's January 20, 1961, inauguration speech and Kennedy's November 22/25, 1963, slaying and burial are part of the fulfillment of Daniel 7:11.

Here is #1959–Doc 1, which is the content of John F. Kennedy's January 20, 1961, inauguration speech, with its plethora of "great words which the horn spake," including the best known words from the speech, "And so, my fellow Americans: ask not what your country can do for you—ask what you can do for your country." Essentially, John F. Kennedy was representative of the mouth of America and its great words from its very beginning.
