Key Understanding: *The fall feasts*. The seventh (7th) month of the Hebrew calendar is Tishri. The three feasts in the fall month of Tishri are (i) the Feast of Trumpets (Rosh Hashanah), (ii) the Feast of the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur), and (iii) the Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkoth). These three feasts are found in the Book of Leviticus, chapter 23.

The Feast of Trumpets (Rosh Hashanah), the 1st day of the month of Tishri

Leviticus 23:23-25 (KJV) And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, 24 Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, In the seventh month, in <u>THE FIRST DAY OF</u> THE MONTH, SHALL YE HAVE A SABBATH, A MEMORIAL OF BLOWING OF

TRUMPETS, an holy convocation.

25 Ye shall do no servile work therein: but ye shall offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD.

The Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur), the 10th day of the month of Tishri

Leviticus 23:26-32 (KJV) And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, 27 Also on <u>THE TENTH DAY OF THIS SEVENTH MONTH THERE SHALL BE A</u> <u>DAY OF ATONEMENT</u>: it shall be an holy convocation unto you; and ye shall afflict your

souls, and offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD.

28 And ye shall do no work in that same day: for it is <u>A DAY OF ATONEMENT</u>, to make an atonement for you before the LORD your God.

29 For whatsoever soul it be that shall not be afflicted in that same day, he shall be cut off from among his people.

30 And whatsoever soul it be that doeth any work in that same day, the same soul will I destroy from among his people.

31 Ye shall do no manner of work: it shall be a statute for ever throughout your generations in all your dwellings.

32 It shall be unto you a sabbath of rest, and ye shall afflict your souls: in the ninth day of the month at even, from even unto even, shall ye celebrate your sabbath.

The Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkot), beginning the 15th day of the month of Tishri

Leviticus 23:33-44 (KJV) And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

34 Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, <u>THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF THIS SEVENTH</u> <u>MONTH SHALL BE THE FEAST OF TABERNACLES FOR SEVEN DAYS UNTO</u> <u>THE LORD</u>.

35 On the first day shall be an holy convocation: ye shall do no servile work therein. 36 Seven days ye shall offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD: on the eighth day shall be an holy convocation unto you; and ye shall offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD: it is a solemn assembly; and ye shall do no servile work therein.

37 These are the feasts of the LORD, which ye shall proclaim to be holy convocations, to offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD, a burnt offering, and a meat offering, a sacrifice, and drink offerings, every thing upon his day:


38 Beside the sabbaths of the LORD, and beside your gifts, and beside all your vows, and beside all your freewill offerings, which ye give unto the LORD.
