## Key Understanding: The pogroms brought Jews from the Pale of Settlement to America.

Emigration via Hamburg, Germany, changed when pogroms began in Russia in 1881. Hamburg served as a safe haven for the Russian Jews and their fellow brethren from Romania and Galicia on their way to the New World, the United States of America.

Jews migrate to America from the **Pale.** After the assassination of Tsar Alexander II in Russia in 1881, the wave of pogroms in Russia and Eastern Europe led to a large number of Jewish immigrants to the United States and other countries. A characteristic feature of the Jewish migration was the migration of whole families; another characteristic was that very few of those who migrated returned to their countries of origin. Of the Jews who migrated from the Pale of Settlement and Russia, more than 90 percent settled in the United States.

Many of the Jewish immigrants arrived in New York City and stayed there, in the densely-packed Lower East Side. Here a Jewish immigrant found housing in one of the crowded tenement buildings (at more than 700 people per acre, the Lower East Side
