Unsealing #2146 was about Woodrow Wilson's war message of April 2, 1917, and the ending of the Pale of Settlement by the democratic Provisional Government on April 2, 1917.

Key Understanding: The White Horse and its rider are seen on April 2, 1917, and the Pale Horse and its rider are associated with April 2, 1917. For now, let's note that the White Horse (and its rider) of Revelation 6:2 is seen with Woodrow Wilson's war message of April 2, 1917, and the Pale Horse (and its rider) of Revelation 6:7-8 is seen with the "ending" of the Pale of Settlement by the democratic Provisional Government on April 2, 1917.

(i) April 2, 1917 – Woodrow Wilson's war message

President Woodrow Wilson entered the packed and cheering chamber of the House of Representatives at 8:32 p.m., April 2, 1917. The speech included . . .


<u>The world must be made safe for democracy</u>. Its peace must be planted upon the tested foundations of political liberty.
