Key Understanding: *The Pale Horse arises in conjunction with the White Horse, the Red Horse, and the Black Horse.* This segment of Unsealings is for the purpose of understanding that the Pale Horse and its rider arise in conjunction with the rise of the White Horse, the Red Horse, and the Black Horse. A Pair of Balances. A particular attribute of the Black Horse Rider is that "he that sat on him had <u>a pair of balances</u> in his hand." A balance represents scales, as an emblem of judgment and power.

## The Third Seal – The Black Horse Rider, Revelation 6:5-6

Revelation 6:5-6 (KJV) And when he had opened <u>THE THIRD</u> <u>SEAL</u>, I heard the third beast say, Come and see. And I beheld, and lo <u>A BLACK HORSE</u>; and he that sat on him had <u>A PAIR OF</u> BALANCES IN HIS HAND.

Key Understanding: *The black horse judge*. The Black Horse Rider sits in judgment, with a pair of balances in his hand.



The question is, Who does the Black Horse Rider judge? A part of the answer is that the Black Horse Rider judges (defeats) the Red Horse Rider. Before we get to that, however, we need to add depth to the prophetic story.
