

## part 442, The Pale Horse, (xxxix), The Fourth Part of the Earth: The Monroe Doctrine encompassed the Fourth Part of the World

The Monroe Doctrine. The Monroe Doctrine was set forth by President James Monroe in a message he delivered to the Congress of the United States on December 2, 1823. It warned European powers against interfering in the affairs of countries in the Western Hemisphere, and specifically warned them not to involve themselves with the peoples of the Western Hemisphere "for the purpose of oppressing them, or controlling in any other manner their destiny." The Monroe Doctrine said also that the American continents were "henceforth not to be considered as subjects for future colonization by any European powers." [The Monroe Doctrine has previously been discussed in Unsealings #155, #1724-#1726, #1730, #1732, #1736, and #1740.]

The New World of the Americas was called the fourth part of the world The first three parts of the world were considered to be Europe, Asia, and Africa



Key Understanding: *The Monroe Doctrine*. Obviously, the Monroe Doctrine encompassed the Western Hemisphere, or the so-called "fourth part of the world." The first question is, does the Western Hemisphere, or the "fourth part of the world," addressed by James Monroe in the Monroe Doctrine, have anything to do with the Pale Horse Rider and "power was given unto them over the fourth part of the earth," and if so, why is there such a prophetic relationship?
