Event 1

April 2, 1917

America exercising its role as the Pale Horse Rider, in the form of declaring war and defeating the Prussian (German) Empire.

The Pale Slaying of the Second Reich German Empire

Woodrow Wilson, April 2, 1917: the "to kill with sword" rider on the Pale Horse making the whole world – both the Western Hemisphere and the Eastern Hemisphere – safe for democracy.

Alexander Kerensky's democratic Provisional Government – which prophetically represents the United States of America – ends the Russian Pale of Settlement.
