
Key Understanding: 68 years after the U.S. entry into World War I came Pale Rider. More specifically, Pale Rider was released on June 28, 1985 – 68 years (+ 2 months + 11 days + 11 days) after the April 6, 1917, entry of the United States into World War I – for the purpose of confirming that the United States was fully stepping into its prophetic role as the primary Pale Horse Rider of Revelation 6:7-8.

The plot of *Pale Rider*. A cadre of men employed by powerful strip-miner Coy LaHood (Richard Dysart) rides into a small mining encampment and begins shooting up the place.
