Though we covered in Unsealing #2257 the example of Christian Autocracy living by the sword and then perishing by the sword at the hands of 'preacher with a gun' Christian Democracy, and covered in (the previous) Unsealing #2258 the example of 'preacher with a gun' (and Pale Horse Rider) Christian Democracy killing with the sword and then perishing from the earth by the hand of the Sword of the Lord upon his return, . . .

Key Understanding: *The sword vs. the cross*. The most significant and proper spiritual meaning behind the Lord's words "for all they that take the sword shall perish with the sword" (Matthew 26:52) is explained by and related to the very essence of Christianity and cross-carrying, "for whosoever will save his life shall lose it." The sword is the ultimate representative of "saving your life," and thus the representative of "losing it" eternally.

Matthew 26:51-52 (KJV) And, behold, one of them which were with Jesus stretched out his hand, and drew his sword, and struck a servant of the high priest's, and smote off his ear.

52 Then said Jesus unto him, Put up again thy sword into his place: <u>FOR ALL THEY THAT</u> <u>TAKE THE SWORD SHALL PERISH WITH THE</u> SWORD.


